According to the Kurdistan Board of Investment, the region sets an annual goal of eight percent for Gross Domestic Product (GDP) growth. With more than 47 oil companies working in the Kurdistan region, numerous U.S. businesses and venture capitalists have invested in the region.

As a result of this event, NIVA (Ford) signed up for *Foras'* Jobs Portal. Najih Soub, logistics manager, said: "We expect to hire more than 100 people in the next year, and the *Foras* Jobs Portal will be a huge help."
